## **CHILD Find**

Sevier County Schools are committed to finding students, who are suspected of having disabilities, as early as we can. Children with disabilities that impact their learning have the right to a free, appropriate, public education from the time they turn three years old until they are twenty-one. Tennessee also offers services for children with disabilities from birth until they turn three. Being able to screen and evaluate children before they start school is best. To do this, we need your help.

Part of the Child Find effort involves public notices like this one, to ask for your assistance in identifying children who may qualify for special education services. If you think your child is not picking up speech or learning skills as quickly as others the same age, please contact us. If you know of another child who might not be developing skills other children the same age have, please give the parents or guardians the contact number or electronic mail address on this notice.
